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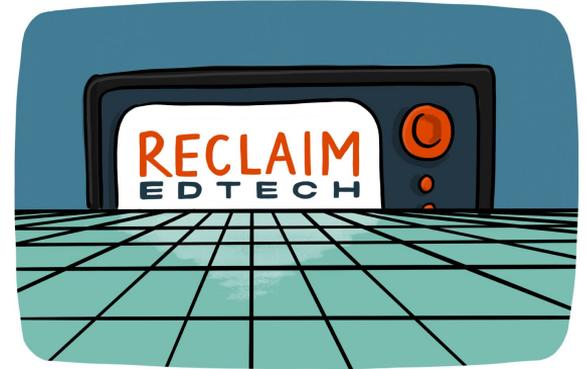

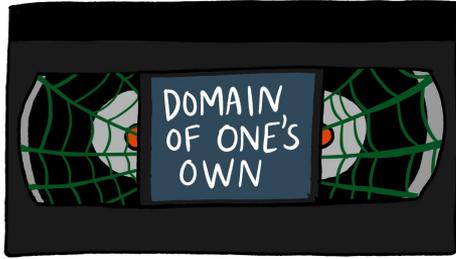

- Lack of ownership and control over social media profiles and networks
- Desire to become more critically digitally and data literate
- Looking for ways to connect and communicate that are aligned to our mission and values for both personal and professional identities

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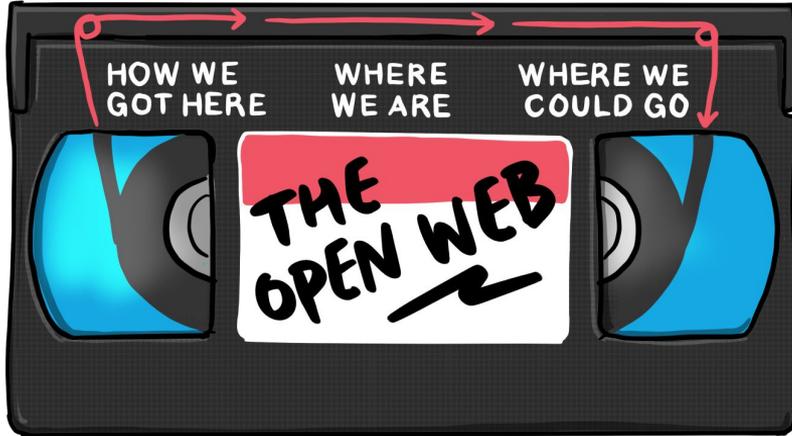

How to take part:

We all know what a post-mortem is, right? It's something that you do after something or someone has died, and is an important learning process.

But what about a pre-mortem? The point of a pre-mortem is to create a 'safe space' to take a look at project risks. All you do is imagine it's six months / a year / however long into the future and the project has failed. The job of the pre-mortem is to identify in advance why that might happen.

In this activity we share examples of the risks we considered as part of our journey to reclaim our socials and invite you to add your own thoughts, comments and reflections related to your own experience whether you're just considering your options or already making changes.
